Sweet Deal on Sourwood

Not often are transplants with a mop root system available in quantity. Stub them off to run up a single new leader, or keep one of the leaders they have now and let them branch lower. Best strategy? ... some of each.

American native, hard-to-find small tree with unusual flowers and brilliant fall color. Its reputation for being difficult to move does not apply with heavy-rooted transplants like these. Plant in a moist but not wet soil, high in organic matter, never in hard clay ground or a droughty site. Or, pot them up in #3-#5 squatty pots for faster resale.

Magnolia sieboldii

Flowers that emerge in late spring over several weeks, so they never succumb to late spring frost. It's tough enough to take winter lows of -35°F and still bloom in May-June without fail. Prefers a spot with afternoon shade, and is especially appealing when grown in a raised landscape spot or large concrete planter where its enchanting blooms with their unique red anthers can be observed from below.
